New SONNET report provides insights on social needs and health care utilization among older adults

Led by David Mosen at Kaiser Permanente Northwest, this project points to potential focus areas for social health interventions

The latest report from SONNET's Evaluation and Research Committee (ERC) focuses on social needs among Kaiser Permanente Northwest members age 65 and older — and on how these needs are linked to health care utilization.


Led by ERC member <u>David Mosen</u>, <u>PhD</u>, <u>MPH</u>, the project combined electronic health record data and neighborhood data with results from Kaiser Permanente's Medicare Total Health Assessment survey to better understand how social needs contribute to emergency department (ED) and inpatient hospital encounters in older adults. **READ REPORT**.

Snapshot of key findings:

- Having more social needs was linked to higher ED utilization and hospital admissions.
 For example, members with 2 social needs were
 98% more likely to have an ED visit and 65% more likely to have 1 or more hospital admissions.
- Financial strain, housing instability, and social isolation were significantly linked to future ED use, and financial strain was significantly linked to future hospital admissions.




These findings point to **potential focus areas for social health interventions:** populations with 2 or more social needs and populations who are specifically facing financial strain, housing instability, or social isolation.

AJPM Focus highlights work by SONNET and its Evaluation and Research Committee to develop an empirical research agenda

Kaiser Permanente is just one of the nation's many health care systems that are prioritizing patients' social health. But with **limited evidence to guide social health integration strategies**, researchers need ways to identify the most relevant and important empirical research questions to pursue.

<u>Published recently in AJPM Focus</u>, SONNET's latest peer-reviewed paper reports on results of a rigorous partner-driven process used to identify social health research opportunities. The paper offers ranked and topic-driven lists as a guide for other researchers in this space and can serve as an example for other systems interested in undertaking their own agenda-setting and social health initiatives.
